- Non-profit volunteer organization, formed to celebrate Beverly's birthday in 2026
- Planning new events and programs throughout the year
 - Re-enactment of the Hannah vs Nautilus battle
 - Vietnam Wall traveling exhibit
 - Stories project
 - Indigenous Peoples Day, Night Circus, Porchfest, Road Race, etc
- Funded thru private donations, state and city grants, Community Preservation Act, ticket sales (most events are free)
- The "+" is recognition that the land currently occupied is the ancestral land of the Naumkeag people

What's Our Legacy?



- Refresh Independence Park it needs some love!
- One of the most historic spots in Beverly, but few know why



Goals of the Project



- 1. Make the park accessible for all
- 2. Tell the stories of what happened at the park with new signage

In doing this, we'll also upgrade the look of the park, improve safety and create opportunities to use the park in new ways.

Project Details



- Original ideas came from Friends of Independence Park
- Working with Halvorson, a division of Tighe & Bond Studio
- Received \$125,000 from the CPC to complete Phase 1
 - Design through to bid documents (incl necessary approvals)
 - Phase 1 complete August/Sept
- City expects to complete installation mid-2026
- Note that CPC grant does not include signage, which we will fund with other means; Halverson has designed the plan to allow room for the signage

Notes before the Reveal



- The area of work is from the sidewalk down to the main path; Bev Dept of Public Services has directed us not to work below it as that area is included in the city's Beach Management Project
- Earlier version of the plan shows only the plaque and not the large rock it sits on; given new information about the history of the rock, the plan now references both the rock and the plaque together ("DAR Monument"); new location is tbd
- Materials have not yet been addressed; that will happen once the design is finalized and we have a handle on available funding
